# **Pupil Voice Survey Results Summary**



#### **Expectations**

 The overall response to questions regarding expectations were positive with a small number of children disagreeing with the statement of adults helping with their school work. A small number of children disagreed when asked about knowing the school rules.

### The Learning Experience

• These questions showed a more mixed response to answers. Almost half of those children asked answered 'No' when asked whether other children behave well to allow them to learn. A quarter of children asked did not know what their learning targets are.

#### Contribution

 Whilst most of the responses were positive to these questions, there was a group of children who said they did not feel that their views were heard in school.

### Relationships with staff and other pupils

 A higher number of negative responses in this section. Children disagreed with the fact that behaviour is good in school and feel that they don't get on with other children well.

#### Wellbeing



Most children enjoy being at school and feel that staff are doing a good job.


