Ancient Egyptian Coffins Unearthed in Luxor

What was mummification?

- The ancient Egyptians believed that the soul was trapped in the body.
- Mummification meant a body could be preserved even in the hot temperatures of Egypt.

Archaeologists have discovered 30 perfectly preserved mummies in Egypt. They were found in colourful coffins in Luxor, on the western side of the river Nile.

They were decorated with hieroglyphics, which was ancient Egyptian writing. The coffins belonged to men, women and children from a period lasting between 945 BC and 715 BC.

Zahi Hawass, an expert on ancient Egypt, told BBC News that the coffins will "enrich our knowledge".

Archaeologists say the people were related to priests. Priests looked after the temples, where people prayed to the gods.

Preserving the body after death was really important to ancient Egyptians.

Experts believe a member of this family hid the coffins because he or she feared that they would be looted.

During Ancient Egyptian times, priceless goods were buried in the tombs of wealthy people. Tomb robbers would then come and steal the goods because they were very valuable.

So what was mummification and why was it so important to the ancient Egyptians? They believed that the body needed to be in good condition for the afterlife.

Mummification meant a body would not decay as a result of the warm weather in Egypt. Powerful people, such as the pharaohs (the rulers of Egypt), were determined to make it to the

afterlife, where they would live with the gods. They made sure they were mummified and even built huge tombs and pyramids to make sure no one could interfere with their bodies.

The coffins will be displayed at the Grand Egyptian Museum. It's a new museum which will open next year, close to the Great Pyramid. It will showcase world-famous ancient Egyptian objects, such as the treasures of Tutankhamun.

He was a pharaoh whose tomb was discovered in 1922 by Howard Carter, a British archaeologist.
