






MyLOL is a free social networking and dating site aimed at teens. Profiles can publicly display users' images and information, including sexual orientation and personal interests. The service bills itself as "the number one teen dating website in the world", claiming to have more than a million users globally. Despite its popularity, the MyLOL app is no longer available from Google Play or the App Store, although the site is still active. In some countries, police forces and schools have previously warned parents about "sinister predators" and "inappropriate activities" on the site.


Don't forget booklets can be brought into school after every activity that is completed, no need to wait until all 7 are done. Please bring them to Fox class at lunchtime.

Ingredients

1 tbsp salt

- 1.5kg bag plain flour
 2 sachets dried yeast
 900ml warm water
 - 2. Add the warm water

Method

- 3. Mix together to form a dough.
- 4. Knead the dough.
- 5. Leave the dough to rise in a covered bowl.

1. Sieve flour, salt and yeast into a bowl.

- Line a baking tray with baking parchment, roll the dough into a ball and put it into the tin.
- Bake in an oven at 220°C for 25 to 30 minutes until the loaf is golden brown. It should sound hollow when tapped from underneath.
- 8. Leave the bread to cool then slice it and enjoy!


